PARENT GOVERNOR VACANCIES

We have vacancies for <u>TWO</u> parent governors on our Governing Board, as Michelle Palmer's term of office has come to an end and Barry Hough has stepped down due to family commitments. We would like to thank both Michelle and Barry for their contribution to the Governing Board.

The role of the governor is to support the management and organisation of the school as part of a team appointed by the Church, LA, Community, school staff and parents. The usual term of office is for four years. Full Board meetings take place four times a year, usually starting at 6.00pm. There are two main committees, which each meet termly, so three times a year. Governors would usually sit on at least one committee

The work of the Governing Board forms an important part of the school leadership and is an opportunity for parents to offer their skills and support to ensure the best possible education provision for our pupils. On this occasion, a parent with knowledge and experience of health & safety or building projects or provision for pupils with SEND would complement the current skills' set of the Board. However, this does not preclude parents with other skills/experience from putting their name forward.

Parents having a child registered at the school at the time of nomination are invited to stand as a parent representative on the Governing Board. Elected members of the council cannot be appointed as a governor under this category.

Nominees must seek two other parents/carers of children registered at the school to support them and sign a nomination form, which can be found at the back of this newsletter. This should be returned to Mrs Cowey by noon on Monday 27th November.

If more than two candidates are nominated, it will be necessary to hold an election.

ATTENDANCE

We are delighted to report that our school attendance is almost back up to our excellent pre-pandemic levels. Whole school attendance is currently 96.7% and we are aiming for at least 97%. Y2, Y3 and Y4 all have over 97% attendance with Y4 currently the healthiest year group in school at 98.1%. 4C have won the Attendance Bear more than any other class.

Could we please remind parents that the government does not allow us to authorise term time holidays, unless there are extraordinary reasons. Any requests for leave must be made in writing prior to any arrangements being confirmed.
