Attendance

You will be aware from national news coverage that the government is asking all schools to tighten up on attendance procedures to make sure more children are in school more of the time. There is still a large discrepancy between attendance rates now to before the pandemic. With the recent spate of bugs and colds, our whole school attendance has dropped to 95% which is well below our target of 97%. Worryingly, we have 36 children whose attendance is less than 90%, the government's threshold for "persistent absence". Every three weeks we look at each child's attendance and Mrs Dwan will contact parents in writing where there is a concern. Could we please remind parents that the government does not allow us to authorise term time holidays, unless there are extraordinary reasons. Any requests for leave must be made in writing prior to any arrangements being confirmed.



If your child is absent for any reason, please ring the office rather than sending an email to the office or year group. You can ring at any time and leave a voice message. This will be picked up first thing each morning. Thanks for your support.








Choir Bringing a Smile!
