For several years now, we have alternated a science week and an arts week in school, where the usual curriculum is collapsed and enhanced by a range of activities, many involving professional visitors

to school. This year is the turn of Science Week, and our science subject leader, Miss Murdock, has been extremely busy organising the different events for each year group. These include virtual reality experiences, a mobile zoo, "Silly Science" and science-themed buddy time. The cost of all the activities is fully funded by the school budget and FOSLS, so there is no additional cost to parents and carers. #### London Marathon 2024 and #kNOwKnifeCrime

On Wednesday 17th April, we will be holding a Mini Marathon event, where each class will run a total of 26 miles around the running track, meaning we will run 14 marathons as a school!

In addition to this, we have teamed up with #kNOwKnifeCrime campaign, alongside 81 other schools across Sefton, to support fundraising for bleeding control kits and cabinets to be installed outside schools in Sefton. Pupils in Year 5 and Year 6 will be having a virtual assembly from the #kNOwKnifeCrime campaigner Laura Hughes, to



educate the children on the campaign's efforts to keep our community safe and well-resourced in the event someone needs medical assistance. The purpose of teaming up with this campaign is to raise awareness of the dangers of carrying a knife and to raise money to purchase bleeding control kits in our local community.

A Sefton Headteacher, Christina Greaves from Kew Woods Primary School, and one of our own St Luke's former parent governors, Michelle Palmer, will be running the actual London Marathon to raise money for this cause.

The 82 schools across Sefton will be taking part in a relay event, running between schools with a bleed control kit as a baton. Our leg will be run by four pupils and two members of staff. The event will be covered by the media and supervised by the police across Sefton. To support the campaign, we are requesting a donation of £1 per pupil, payable on Spider. In return, children can wear Sports Mufti on the day of the event, Wednesday 17th April. Thank you in anticipation of your support for this worthwhile cause.



## Roots and Shoots Donation from Formby Parish Council Community Fund

Formby Parish Council has kindly approved our application for grant funding for an amount of £425 to provide toys and other resources for our weekly Roots and Shoots stay-and-play group. The group, led by Mrs Dwan and supported by other St Luke's

staff, meets in the school hall every Wednesday morning, from 9.15-10.45. Parents, grandparents and childminders bring along children from babies right up to school starting age, and enjoy a variety of songs, games and play activities.

#### **Team Around the School (TAS)**

A reminder of this support system for families: TAS aims to make sure that worries are dealt with at the earliest point and families receive the help they need. Some examples of worries we can help with include: family routines, health, drug/alcohol misuse, emotional wellbeing, housing support, parenting, speech and language development, money worries, managing behaviour and parental relationships. #### **Parent Support Workshops**


