ways to keep your kids safe when gaming

1 - Check the game's content

Most games will contain content warningsif they include content or gameplay which could be deemed harmful inappropriate for certain users or age groups - this can also be reflected through age ratings labelled on the game.

2 - Parental Settings

By checking the game settings, there is often the option to limit certain features of the game such as online access, expletives, gaming with strangers and online chat rooms within the game.

It is also worth having a look at console settings to reduce the chances of your child coming across with game inappropriate content.

3 - Communication is key

Talk to your children about the games they are playing - if you allow an open discussion about the content of these games and whether it's appropriate.

Communication is also vital in the chance that they are experiencing toxic online / gaming environments with bullying or expletives interrupting their enjoyment.

4 - Set boundaries

It is important to be aware of how long your child is spending on their games console as there is the risk of addiction or dependency forming.

Setting clear boundaries for the amount of time they can spend gaming can be important in reducing these risks.

5 - Monitor Payments

Most modern game consoles and systems allow for games to be purchased for instant download. Try and avoid saving your payment details on the system after any previous purchases as this will reduce the chances of your child buying a game without your permission.

More than 30 talented young actors and musicians from St. Mary's College took part in the classic play Oedipus by Sophocles in the studio at Southport's prestigious Atkinson arts centre on Lord Street.

The play, written in the 5th century BC, tells the story of Corinthian Prince Oedipus who fulfils a horrifying prophesy by unwittingly killing his father and marrying his mother on his way to becoming King of Thebes.

Despite its age, the play is still highly regarded and unfolds as a compelling mix of murder mystery, political thriller and psychological whodunnit.

The complexity of the play's themes, were very successfully brought to life by the St. Mary's company which included in other key roles James Domville (Creon), Oliver Sugden (Tiresias) and Eleanor Fyfe and Eleanor Arthur (Antigone Ismene).

The production also featured a classical Greek chorus of ten pupils and atmospheric incidental music chosen and arranged by a five-piece on-stage band, led by Juliette Duncan. Other well-received aspects of the play included two dance interludes by Annie Grealis and Lola Thomas on. both of whom choreographed their own performances an ode spoken in Ancient Greek by Edward Newton, with a translation by Verity Clark.

Spring clean your way to a safer home

t this time of year, we tend to take steps to make our homes a little tidier and Mersevside Fire & Rescue Service (MFRS) is urging people to take this opportunity to say goodbye to the clutter and make sure your family knows what to do in the event of a fire.

Every second counts when escaping a fire and the most important thing you can do to keep you and your family safe is to have working smoke alarms. You should have AT LEAST ONE working smoke alarm on each level of your home. Consider installing additional alarms in rooms with electrical devices or sleeping areas.

Remember to keep internal doors closed during the night as they help reduce how quickly fire and smoke spreads around the house

If you don't have working smoke alarms, give us a call on 0800 731 5958. Smoke alarms are fitted free of charge for those over 65 or meeting certain criteria

But remember, smoke alarms might give you the warning you need to get out of the home safely, but blocked exits and locked doors can add crucial seconds to your escape time. Woodward. Lauren Group Manager at MFRS, said: "Every second counts when escaping a fire. Having working smoke alarms and knowing the escape plan in an emergency could make all the difference."If you have dependents or someone less able to care for, it could take more time to get out, stay out and call 999. Make sure you're always prepared, your exits are clear and everyone knows what to do if the worst should happen.

Do you close your internal doors at night? Do you switch off and unplug electrical tems? Simple things like this can make all the difference. Before you go to bed tonight, be sure to follow our bedtime checklist to keep your and your family safe.

- Close internal doors at night
- Switch off and unplug electrical appliances unless they are designed to be left on don't charge mobile phones and other electrical devices overniaht
- Put candles and cigarettes out properly – don't smoke in bed
- Make sure exit routes are clear and keys are where everyone can find them.
- Take your phone to bed with you so you can call for help in the event of an emergency. Remember, in the event of a fire: get out, stay out and call 999



DON'T IGNORE YOUR NEIGHROUR'S SMOKE ALARM

It's really important that you take action if you hear a neighbour's smoke alarm and call 999 if you suspect a fire in a nearby property – a delay in alerting the emergency services to a fire can be the difference between life and death.

If you hear a smoke alarm, either as a resident or a neighbour, take action immediately and call 999. If you suspect a fire, get out, stay out and call 999.

Make sure you follow these smoke alarm top tips:

- Install at least one smoke alarm on every level of your home
- The ideal position is on the ceiling, in the middle of a room or on a hallway or landing
- Consider fitting additional alarms in other rooms where there are electrical appliances and near sleeping areas
- Don't put alarms in or near kitchens and bathrooms where smoke or steam can set them off by accident
- Test your smoke alarms every week
- Replace your smoke alarms every ten years.





How to Keep Children Interested in Sport

Start young

One way to ensure your child remains passionate for sport is to encourage it throughout their younger vears. **Perhaps** encouraging a sport which is separate from their school social circle might help as they develop friendships with others outside of their normal environments, supporting their enjoyment of these external activities through friendship.



Another way to keep your child interested in sport is to keep a positive framing around the activity. Rather than focusing on how you child can improve, and pushing towards higher levels of performance, praise the skill and enioyment they have had so far. It might be tempting to aim your child for higher, such as joining regional competitions, example, but this competitive nature might not be what your child needs

STAND UP TO **STAND OUT**

Initiatives such as Stand Up. Speak Out aim to encourage people to speak out against bullying, harassment, and other unacceptable behaviour in society. Not only can sport have a physical benefit for children, but it can be a



charitable activity for those who want to make a difference in an area of their choice

Mental well-being

might also consider educating you child around the benefits of sport. While they may understand the physical benefits, it is important to open up about mental well-being and the improvements that regular exercise can have on their mental health. Exercise not only helps mental health by reducing stress, but it can also have other cognitive benefits such as improving and memory concentration.

Set an example

Children who grow up in a household with inactive parents are more likely to be inactive themselves. So, by being active yourself, you are instilling a lifestyle which your teenagers are more likely to follow.

For girls especially, 50% guit sport due to the onset of their period. Girls might feel more comfortable competing in sport during puberty if they have seen other women in their life also go through this. Sport is not just a healthy activity for your children to be into, but it also has many ethically and mentally positive impacts.

From speaking out against a range of discriminations in society, to improving your child's own mental health, sport can bring people together and encourage change. Making sure vour child feels safe to explore their own identity, practice sport, and follow your example could make the difference in them maintaining exercise into adulthood.


