Lunchtime Staff

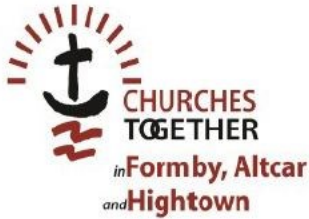

Attendance



After several bouts of sickness and sore throats, our whole school attendance has dipped slightly to 96%. Y4 remains the healthiest year group in school at 97.5%. 4C have won the Attendance Bear (best weekly attendance) more than any other class, with 3R hot on their heels!

This will be picked up first thing each morning, whereas emails can take a while to be discovered in a busy inbox! Thanks for your support.

Parking for Wraparound Club

Parents /Carers must not park on the school driveway when dropping off/picking up for Wraparound as it presents a danger to others coming and going.

If you arrive for After-School pick up after 5pm and there is room in the staff carpark without blocking cars in, you are welcome to use it. This is not possible for Breakfast Club as it is a busy time for staff arriving and all spaces are needed.

Parking for School

The staff carpark can only be used by disabled drivers using the designated spaces. When parking on the road, please be courteous of our neighbours: we have been getting complaints that neighbours cannot get off their own driveway because someone is parked across it. In a couple of cases, the parent has refused to move and insisted they won't be long! This does not fit with our school ethos and our Christian Values of kindness and respect!
