Cross-Country

Sefton Schools' cross-country league ended with the 4th and final race at Merchants playing fields. Scott in Y5, bravely stepped up and represented the Y6 team to ensure school could earn valuable league points. Scott, Noah and Joel's efforts ensured that Caden's fantastic first place was rewarded with the Y6 boys' team taking the bronze medal position, at the end of a long and successful season.



The **SWAC Sefton Junior Schools' Cross-Country Competition on Birkdale Common** saw excellent

performances from every single one of the 26 St Luke's competitors over this hilly course. We secured top three finishes for each of our 4 representative teams. Caden secured first place in a brilliant display of resilience, winning in a commanding time of 9mins 48secs.

The exceptional team effort was rewarded by St. Luke's being crowned **SWAC Challenge Cup Winners 2024**. Congratulations to all!

SWAC 1 Mile Races for Schools, Victoria Park.

This was the first competitive race for our young Y3 athletes and they did us proud. Each of the seven runners displayed commitment and determination in preparation during running club and again at the race, the first of many we hope.



11 athletes from other year groups competed on the night and proved that St. Luke's are a force to be reckoned with. Our Y3 boys' team finished in overall second position and we also brought home 2 medals: Millie (Y5) won her first competitive cross-country medal, securing bronze in an impressive 7.03mins.

Caden continued to dominate, winning another gold for Y6 boys with a time of 6.08mins. Fantastic running!
