

### How can I use this with my children?

Make your own Viking Trollen wheel to weave a Viking braid at home with wool or string.

## How does this help my children's learning?

Drawing an accurate circle and using it to mark out 8 evenly spaced slots for weaving your yarn may encourage counting and accurate measuring.

## Ideas for further learning:

Why not use a range of colours to create patterned braids? Use this technique to make friendship bracelets or Viking key chains.




# Viking Trollen Craft

### You will need:

- cardboard
- pencil
- ruler
- scissors
- string or wool
- masking tape (optional)
- ribbon (optional)

#### **Instructions:**

- Draw a circle onto the cardboard at least
  10cm in diameter.
- 2. Carefully cut it out with scissors.
- 3. Draw a smaller circle in the middle, about the size of a 10p and cut this out too.
- 4. Mark 8 slots, evenly spaced around the edge of the circle and cut small triangles in to them about 1cm in the circle.
- 5. Number each slot from 0 to 7.
- 6. Cut seven lengths of wool about 40cm long and tie them together at one end with a knot.
- 7. Thread the yarn through the hole and tape or hold the knot at the back of the card circle.
- 8. Thread each of the seven threads through one of the numbered slots. Leave slot O empty.



- 9. Move the yarn at slot 3 to the one marked 0.
- Move the next yarn at slot 5 to the now empty slot 3.
- 11. Move the next yarn at slot 7 to the empty slot 5.
- 12. Move the yarn in slot 1 to number 7.
- 13. Keep repeating and rotating the disc.
- 14. As you continue, a braid will start to appear from the middle of the circle.
- 15. Keep going until you have your desired length or until you have no more yarn left to weave.
- 16. Remove the yarn from the card and tie with a knot or secure with a ribbon.

Your first Trollen braid may seem a little loose. As you practise, you can learn about the tension and it will tighten up.
